## **International Industry, Policy, and Thought Leaders Convene in Jakarta to Address Regional Energy and Climate Change Challenges**

*2011 Pacific Energy Summit Gathers Decision-Makers to Explore the Prospects of Natural Gas as a Low-Carbon Alternative to Fuel the Asia-Pacific's Rapidly Escalating Energy Demand*

The Asia-Pacific is the world's most dynamic economic region, driving a rapid expansion in global energy demand. This unprecedented growth, coupled with heavy regional reliance on coal for power supplies, has led to surging greenhouse gas emissions and environmental concerns.

The 2011 Pacific Energy Summit brings together key regional experts, industry executives, and policy leaders to promote market-driven policies that address the twin challenges of rising energy demand and global climate change. This year's Pacific Energy Summit theme, "Unlocking the Potential of Natural Gas in the Asia-Pacific," focuses on the prospects for natural gas—an increasingly abundant, low-emission fossil fuel—to accelerate the transition to a low-carbon economy, while supporting continued economic growth.

"The breadth of economic, energy and climate security challenges we face today require unprecedented cooperation and collaboration across many countries and regions, the energy industry and among research institutions," said **Mikkal Herberg**, Research Director, Energy Security Program at the National Bureau of Asian Research (NBR), which hosts the Summit. "In convening high-level individuals to focus on the potential of natural gas, the Summit has a key role to play to help build momentum for greater economic, energy and climate security in the region."
